Tell Us

- Does inSPIRE Rock know the exact location where the rock will be set up? (Must be a 25'x25' area on level ground away from power lines, distractions, trees, and loud noises. A sketch or drawing would be helpful.)
- Send us a schedule for your day, outlining the session times and number of students in each session (up to six one-hour sessions for a full day, no more than 70 students per hour).

Spread the Word

- Send permission slip home (it is written in English and Spanish), to be returned at least 2-3 days prior to the event. Students are not allowed to climb without a signed parent/guardian permission slip.
- Give the teachers the pre and post classroom lessons, to prepare the students for the character program beforehand and to reinforce the lesson afterward.
- You may want to notify local newspaper and/or TV news of your event.

Get Ready

- Have a check written (payable to inSPIRE Rock) to give to the RSC staff on the day of the event.
- Collect permission slips.
- Show the students the Rock Solid Character video the week of the event. View the video here: [Rock Solid Character Video on YouTube](#)
- Check the weather. If questionable weather is predicted in your area, contact RSC at least 2 days before the event to discuss options.
- Arrange lunch for the RSC staff. (kindly requested)
- Make name tags for students. (optional)

Sit Back and Enjoy!

- The RSC team usually travels the evening before the event and stays overnight at a local hotel near the school. In the morning the team arrives at the school to begin setup at least 30 minutes prior to the first presentation.
- During the event, each group (up to 70 students) gathers around the rock, and a 10-15 minute character lesson begins, likening the handholds on the rock to "The 7 Handholds for Success." Students are given instruction in proper climbing technique.
- Students are then put into harnesses and given the opportunity to climb the character rock. Teachers are encouraged to participate with the students.
- Following the climbing time there is a short session to reinforce the lesson, and each student receives a RSC sticker and a "Gripper's Gazette" newspaper.
- The students are then dismissed, and the RSC team prepares for the next group.
